Editorial warning that Republicans were waging a war against slavery

The recent elections have resulted in the election of an increased number of opposition

members of Congress, over those of the present Session. In New York, Senator Seward has come

out with a platform which contains the true doctrines of Black Republicanism. Slavery is not

only to be kept out of all new States, but war is to be made on it in those States where it exists,

until it is finally exterminated from every State in the Union, and the sunny South brought down

to a level with Jamaica.

In order to exterminate slavery war is to be made on the Democratic party by Seward and

his cohorts of Black Republicans, as our party is the only obstacle that stands in the way of the

accomplishment of the objects desired by them.

In the next presidential contest there can be but two parties, the Democratic and only

national party, and the Black Republican or sectional party. All true patriots, however, they may

have heretofore differed on political questions, it seems to us, must rally to the Democratic

standard as the only hope of safety for the perpetuity of the Union. The people must rise in the

majesty of their strength, and crush out the dangerous heresies of Seward and Co. or our country

will be no longer one great Republic, but divided into sectional parties, and the theatre where an

unnatural warfare will be waged, brother against brother and father against son. May the

Supreme Ruler of the Universe avert this awful state of things, and the spirit of the founders of

the Republic reanimate the men of the present generation, and guide them by the wisdom which

governed in the days of the Revolution, when Jefferson and Hancock, Adams and Henry,

Washington and Greene, stood shoulder to shoulder in defence of a common country and

common rights.
