

At a meeting of the Citizens of Elizabeth City Co., Virginia, held in Hamilton, Decr 22^d 1860, on motion of Mr Baker J. Lee Jr., Dr^r Wm R. Vaughan was elected President, and J. C. Phillips, Secretary.

The following resolutions offered by J. W. Donney were unanimously adopted:

Whereas, the right of self government lies at the foundation of all pure republican institutions, and whereas the state of **South Carolina** by her ordinance of secession has affirmed this right, therefore

Be it resolved, that we, as a people jealous of our liberties, pledge ourselves to sustain her in her independence, and solemnly declare, that we utterly repudiate the despotic theory of coercion, as subversive of the great doctrine of State Sovereignty,

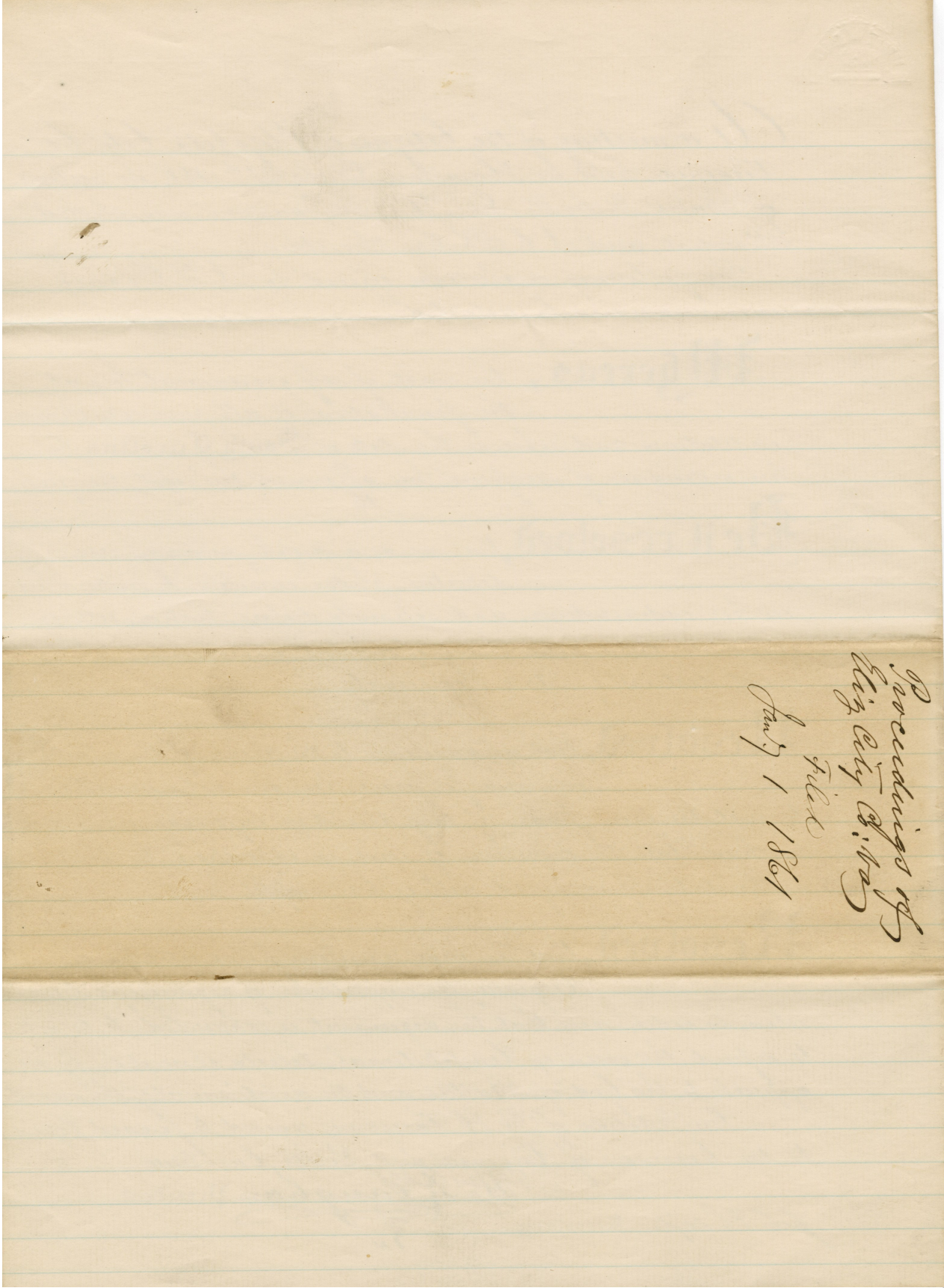
Resolved, that we announce to the people of the North our wish for peace, but our determination to meet the issue of war, if they persist in enforcing upon any Southern State the despotism of force, in opposition to the authoritatively expressed will of her people;

Resolved, that we urge upon our fellow citizens of Virginia the importance of organizing themselves, in order, now that "the argument is exhausted" to be able to defend the cause of Constitutional Liberty, if need be, by an appeal to the God of Battles and the arbitrament of the sword.

On Motion of Dr. H. Vaughan, agreed to forward Copies to the Governors of Virginia and South Carolina
